Kenya's top game reserve, Maasai Mara, is a must-see location because of its wide variety of wildlife and hitting environment.

Day 3: The National Reserve of Maasai Mara

Spend the entire day taking morning and evening game drives in Maasai Mara. You can take advantage of the lodge's activities for the remainder of the day.

Day 4: Exploration Trip to Lake Nakuru National Park

Take a morning drive to Lake Nakuru National Park, which is famous for its picture-perfect flamingos and a wide variety of animals, such as hippos, buffalo, lions, leopards, and the highly threatened Rothschild's giraffe. Within the park's boundaries, white and black rhinos are protected as sanctuary areas. Enjoy a private stay in one of the 25 luxurious camps at Flamingo Hill. Each carefully constructed camp offers a cozy haven in the middle of nature, complete with natural wood furniture, modern conveniences, and decor inspired by safari.

Interesting Maasai Mara Facts

This refuge is a major filming location for the motion picture "Out of Africa." You will see all kinds of wildlife, including the big five, are abundant. The yearly migration of millions of wildebeests, zebras, and gazelles from the Serengeti plains across the Mara River and Tanzanian border to the Maasai Mara grazing fields, which begins in late June, is a sight to behold. There are many different bird species in the game reserve; approximately 452 have been identified. The first resort in the Maasai Mara Game Reserve in southwest Kenya, Keekorok Lodge is surrounded by more than 700 square miles of verdant, sun-filled plains.

Day 5: Adventure in the National Park of Aberdare

Traveling to Aberdare National Park after having breakfast and departing Lake Nakuru National Park left behind. You will see the high valleys with thick forests and enormous moorlands define this beautiful park, offering different environments for a range of wildlife such as black rhinos, elephants, baboons, monkeys, hyenas, buffalos, warthogs, and bushbucks.

Observations of rare animals could include the hard-to-find African wild cat, bongo, golden cat, serval cat, African civet, and blue duiker. Camping in the moorlands, outings, and fishing for trout in the rivers are available to visitors. The park's high bird life, which includes over 250 species of birds, including Jackson's Francolin, sparrowhawks, goshawks, eagles, sunbirds, and plovers, will please bird lovers.

Day6: Back to Nairobi

As you leave Aberdare for Nairobi, say goodbye to Aberdare after enjoying breakfast at The Ark. Reach the busy capital of Kenya by early afternoon, then make your way to Jomo Kenyatta International Airport to board your flight to your destination.

Day 7: Fly Back Home

Take a morning safari in Nairobi National Park, where wildlife mixes with urban environments, after breakfast at The Norfolk. See baby elephant orphans at the David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust Orphanage, or get up close and personal with the Rothschild family giraffes at the Giraffe Centre. Visit the Talisman Restaurant for a late lunch, and then head back to your hotel. Finish your journey with a ride to the airport, leaving Kenya with unforgettable memories and a promise to come back again.
